Fred Clarke started Sunset Valley Orchids in 1995 as a natural outgrowth of a hobby that began 25 years earlier. Sunset Valley Orchids is a "Boutique" style nursery dedicated to providing excellent customer service and breeding superior orchid hybrids for the orchid enthusiast.

The nursery has grown considerably over the last few years and now exceeds 30,000 sq. ft. of greenhouses space.

They are plant breeders of award quality orchids. Efforts are focused in the development of new and interesting lines. They provide unique hybrids and species in several genera including; Cattleya, Catasetinae, Paphiopedilum, Australian Native Dendrobium, and a few others in limited numbers like Sarcochilus, Zygopetalum and Stanhopea.

Fred is a popular speaker on many orchid subjects and travels extensively around the United States, Canada, Australia, New Zealand, South Africa, Latin and South

America.

Sometimes It's Worth the Wait

When we think of Angraecoid orchids we automatically think of Africa and Madagascar but there are ancient relicts of the tribe here in the Western Hemisphere. The leafless genus Dendrophylax (also called Polyrrhiza) found in the Caribbean and southern Florida is one such relict. Dendrophylax (Polyrrhiza) lindenii, called Florida's Ghost Orchid, is rarely encountered but when you see one, especially in habitat, you won't soon forget it. (Editor's note: I think this is the orchid featured in the book and movie The Orchid Thief) The species is critically endangered in Florida and

protected by law but flask-raised seedlings have been available for many years. Notoriously challenging to establish from flask, when one of them flowers it's a stunning site. Mario Ferrusi, a member, friend and trustee living in Toronto sent me this image a couple of weeks ago of a seedling flowering for him for the first time!

Mario writes "The plant originally came from Oak Hill Gardens about 15 years ago as a very small root mass. It's mounted on a small slab of cork bark, (6cm by 12cm, [about 2.4in x 4.75in]). Over the years it has developed some moss growing over the central core of the roots. It is misted heavily almost every morning so that it is nice and dry by evening. It's in my small intermediate to warm greenhouse that goes to about 15C (60F) on the winter nights, summer temperatures can reach 35C (95F). The greenhouse faces south; I hang the plant so it is getting maximum light. During the months from Feb. to mid Oct. there is a 65% shade cloth on the outside of the greenhouse. The inflorescence appeared about the first of April, developed very slowly, and the bud seemed to take forever. I was hoping to take it to the Toronto Center Monthly judging for a show and tell, (not judging), on June 4, but it did not co-operate. All in all, the wait was well worth it! It is a marvel to behold!" – Ron McHatton, 2011 AOS Newsletter

Flourless Chocolate Walnut Cookies

Ingredients:

2.5 cups finely chopped walnuts

3 cups confectioner's sugar

1/2 cup + 3 Tablespoons unsweetened cocoa powder

1/4 teaspoon salt

3 eggs

1 Tablespoon vanilla

Procedure:

Mix sugar, cocoa, and salt. Add walnuts. Add eggs and vanilla. Beat until just moistened.

Drop by teaspoonful onto a baking sheet.

Bake at 350 degrees for ~15 minutes until matte-looking.

During cooling, these cookies will harden.

Bake up a batch and enjoy!
